Road Block = is a task that can only be completed by 1 member of the team. The team will read the hint and they will decide who will complete be before opening the envelope for the directions.


START- Everyone at building with team colors

Grid activity

Number of Participants: 5-25

Props: Gridwalk Tarp and Gridwalk Map

Objective: For the entire group to cross the grid following the pre-determined path.

Setup: Get a tarp (preferably), a sheet, or just some tape on the ground and make a 7x7 grid of squares with each square being 1 square foot.

Rules:

1. One participant on the grid at a time.
2. If the participant steps on the wrong squares (not in the direction of the path), the entire group must start over.
3. The group(s) cannot speak to each other while trying to figure out the path. Although you can stand along the grid up to the point which you have guessed correctly.
4. The facilitator can only respond yes or no to each guess.
